

CASE 1: 5-yr-old boy Oral Ulcers

Hx: fever, drooling

PE: multiple vesicles in oral cavities papulovesicular lesions on palms and soles



CBC: Hct 37%, wbc 12,000/mm3 (N 50%, L 45%, Mo 5%), platelet 150,000 mm3

Q1: DDX

- A. Hand-foot-mouth disease (HFMD)
- B. Herpetic gingivostomatitis
- C. Herpangina
- D. Kawasaki disease

- A. Viral study: EV71, coxsackie, herpes (specimens lesions, NP suction, stool)
- B. Tzanck smear
- C. Echocardiogram
