Case scenario



- A male-infant born at GA 28⁺⁴ weeks by vaginal delivery due to premature rupture of membrane
- His weight was 970 grams with Appar score of 5 and 7 at 1 and 5 minutes, respectively
- The parturient is 25 year-old woman with normal history of prenatal examination
- Ampicillin and gentamicin were given and discontinued after negative blood culture



Case scenario



- He was on ETT and mechanical ventilation for RDS for 7 days
- NP-CPAP was put on after extubation
- He was fed by NG tube and was thriving well
- At the age of 14 days, he developed abdominal distension and feeding intolerance
- X-ray showed marked abdominal distension with pneumoperitoneum
- He went into respiratory failure and required mechanical ventilation
- Subsequently, necrotizing enterocolitis was confirmed



Case scenario



- Emergency operation was carried and a 40 cm necrotic small intestine was removed
- Meropenem 20 mg/kg/dose q 8 h IV was started and TPN was given via peripheral inserted central catheter (PICC)
- He was extubated and put on NP-CPAP 7 days later
- All cultures were negative, however, meropenem was continued
- At DOL of 30, he developed temperature instability
